The Award

Two scholarships will be awarded annually in the amount of \$1000 each.

The Purpose

The purpose of the Auxiliary scholarship is to provide monetary encouragement to seniors to go into the <u>nursing field</u>.

The Procedure

Applications are available through Portage County area high school guidance departments or from the Volunteer Office at University Hospitals Portage Medical Center. It is the responsibility of the student to return completed applications to the Auxiliary Office at UH Portage Medical Center by April 19, 2024. Scholarships are presented annually at the May General Meeting of the Auxiliary.

All applications will be reviewed by a scholarship committee. This committee will review all completed applications and select the scholarship recipients based on the criteria stated below.

The Criteria

- 1. Each applicant must be a resident of Portage County and be eligible to receive a high school diploma with a minimum grade-point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
- Each applicant must be planning to go into the <u>nursing field</u> and accepted to an accredited two-year or four-year institution located within the United States.
- 3. Each applicant should have demonstrated success in leadership, service to the community, and other extra-curricular activities.
- 4. The completed application must include 1) scholarship application form (with accompanying essay), 2) school information form completed by a counselor at the high school with accompanying transcript of grades, and 3) two letters of recommendation from non-family members from the community or school.
- 5. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
